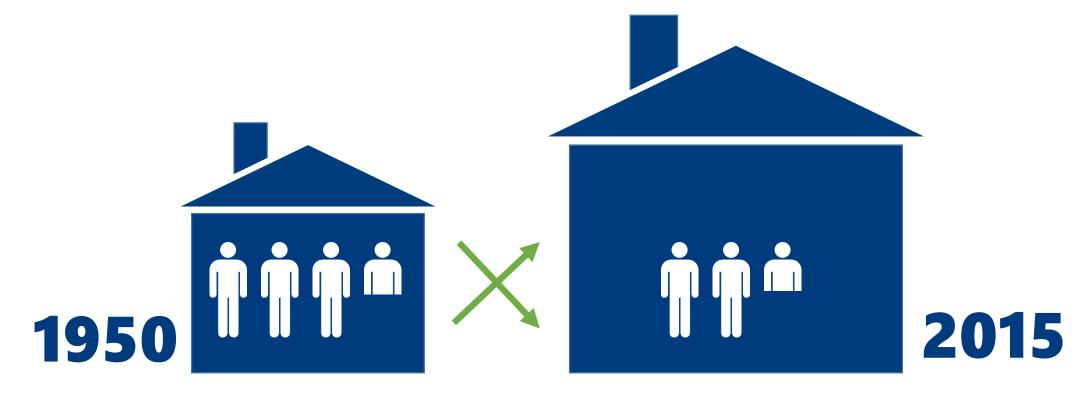

- 4. federal tax reform removes an incentive to own

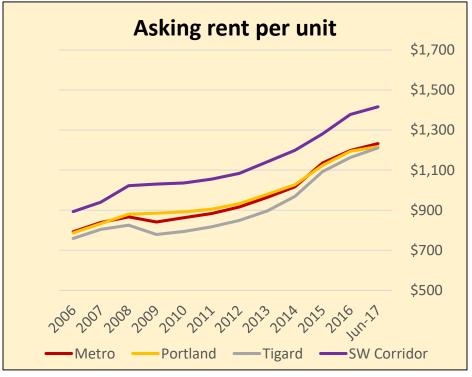
