Pedestrian Safety Enforcement Detail Results

Tigard Police officers issued **2 citations** and **17 warnings** during a Pedestrian Safety Enforcement Detail conducted on the morning of August 27, 2021. Officers were stationed at two crosswalks in Tigard, including one near a school, and focused on drivers who didn't stop for pedestrians. The goal of this effort is to raise driver awareness about pedestrian safety and reduce the risk of automobile-pedestrian crashes and injuries.

As a reminder, every intersection – whether marked or not – is considered a crosswalk in Oregon. With the school year beginning again, the volume of crosswalk traffic will be rising as students and parents make their way to and from school.
