The Next Six Months



Advancing our four City Council goals through the Community Promise - which prioritizes equity, environment, economy, engagement, and excellence – will be our focus in the next six months.

To support the Council goal on houselessness, we are investing American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to hire three team members. We will also empower the Community Houselessness Assessment and Response Team to assist in the development of a long-term strategies. The team will include a city councilor, business community members, non-profit leaders, and other interested groups.

COVID-19 continues to impact our community, and as long as it does, we will continue to support you. In 2022, we will award a sixth round of Tigard CARES funding to local businesses. At the same time, we will invest ARPA funding on economic and housing support.

The Council adopted a **Parks and Rec System Plan** with the goal of every community member being within a 10-minute walk of a park. The development of Steve Street Park and Bagan Park in 2022 will be a couple of the initial steps in reaching the goal.

We will continue to **develop a bold community resiliency plan**. We will be guided by a Racial Equity
Toolkit which centers equity and environmental justice.
This will assist in reducing impacts and unintended
consequences on historically excluded communities.
