IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

In any trial of a traffic violation, the court may admit as evidence the affidavit of a witness in lieu of taking the testimony of the witness orally and in court, subject to ORS 153.080 and the following conditions:

- 1. Testimony by affidavit shall be allowed upon receiving a signed statement of the defendant waiving the right to have the testimony presented orally in court.
- 2. The filing of an affidavit under this rule shall not be deemed to constitute a waiver of trial pursuant to ORS 153.080(4).
- 3. Nothing in this rule shall require the defendant or any witness to waive the right to appear if other testimony is introduced by affidavit as provided by ORS 153.080(5).
- 4. Upon request by a defendant, the court shall provide a form designated "Trial by Affidavit" and containing the following statement:
 - "By filing this affidavit, I understand that I am giving up ("waiving") my right to present my oral testimony in court at trial. I understand that the citing officer and/or witnesses may appear in person. I am asking the court to decide whether I am guilty or not guilty of the above violation(s) based on this affidavit and other evidence submitted to the court. I further understand that I am giving up my right to question or cross-examine the police officer and other witnesses who testify, whether in court or by affidavit."
- 5. If a defendant fails to file an affidavit within the time permitted by the court, a default judgment may be entered.
- 6. If a police officer fails to file an affidavit within the time permitted by the court, the citation shall be dismissed.
- 7. Both parties shall be notified in writing of the results of each trial by affidavit.
