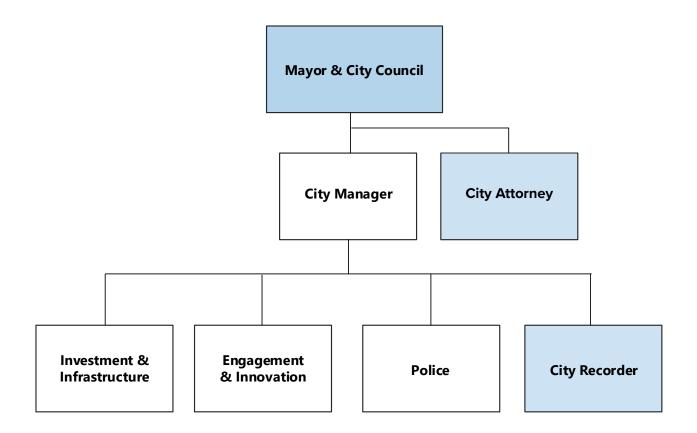

DESCRIPTION & PERFORMANCE MEASURES · MAYOR & CITY COUNCIL

Overview

Operating under a council-manager form of government, the Mayor and City Council are the policy makers elected to represent the community and uphold the City Charter. The Mayor and Councilors serve four-year terms on a non-partisan basis. City Council provides legislative and policy leadership, reviews and adopts city laws and policies, provides oversight on city operations, and sets the overall direction of the city. The Council hires the City Manager to carry out policy and run day-to-day operations and hires the City Attorney for city legal services.



Key Accomplishments in Fiscal Year 2024

- Held a total of 38 City Council meetings in 2023.
- Recognized 20 proclamations throughout the year including Arbor Day, Small Business Saturday, and Play Ball Month.
- Adopted 51 resolutions throughout the year which included the action of appointing dozens of community volunteers to serve on various City boards, committees, and commissions.
- The Council adopted five resolutions as the Town Center Development Agency that included budget adjustments and major project decisions.
- Guided the Tigard team in making progress on community priorities and the 2023-2025 City Council Goals.
- Represented Tigard's interest in regional and statewide activities and coordinated with appropriate agencies and jurisdictions.

Key Investments and Goals for Fiscal Year 2025

- Continue to support and guide the Tigard team in the implementation of community priorities and the 2023-2025
 Council Goals. These include:
 - Reduce Houselessness
 - Address Climate Change
 - Modernize and Improve City Services

DESCRIPTION & PERFORMANCE MEASURES · CITY ATTORNEY

Overview

The role of the City Attorney is to identify, anticipate, and respond to the legal needs of the City of Tigard by providing high-quality, timely, and cost-effective legal services.

The City Attorney provides general legal advice and opinions to the organization, which includes members of City Council and the city's departments and divisions. Additional services include the creation, review, and approval of written contracts and legal documents; advice on complying with increasingly vast and complicated land use laws; the preparation and review of ordinances, resolutions, and other documents; drafting/assisting teams with proposed code and policy changes or revisions; and supervision of outside legal counsel.

Key Accomplishments in Fiscal Year 2024

 Advised the Charter Review Committee which proposed recommendations to City Council that was passed by Tigard voters in May 2024.

Key Investments and Goals for Fiscal Year 2025

- · Continue to provide risk management oversight.
- Continue to provide advice regarding code interpretations, contracts, and intergovernmental agreements.
- · Continue to provide legal support to enforcement efforts throughout the organization.

FY 2024-2025 Performance Measures

Due to the nature of the City Attorney's work, no performance measures have been identified for this year. The City Attorney will continue to evaluate metrics that would show value in the future.

DESCRIPTION & PERFORMANCE MEASURES · CITY RECORDER

Overview

The City Recorder and Records Division prepares Council meeting agendas and public noticing, keeps an accurate record of City Council proceedings, serves as the city's elections officer, and maintains public records and oversees public records requests in accordance with Oregon Public Records Law. The City Charter states the City Recorder "shall serve ex officio as clerk of the council, attend all its meetings unless excused... keep an accurate record of its proceedings... and be the city's elections officer." The charter also provides for a clerk of the Council pro tem (Deputy Recorder), who serves in the Recorder's absence. The City Recorder team maintains the Tigard Municipal Code and Community Development Code and records documents electronically with Washington County.

Key Accomplishments in Fiscal Year 2024

- Continued coordinating hybrid council meetings in Town Hall and kept them accessible to the public through several
 options: attending in person, sending written comments emailed through a special council meeting portal, phoning in
 during a meeting, appearing by video during the meeting or watching video recordings or live streaming available on
 the city's website.
- Responded to public records requests and provided digital access to commonly requested records such as Council,
 Board and Committee meetings and building records through the Weblink portal on the city's website.
- Continued to add permanent records to the electronic document management system and as records were verified, destroyed records that had reached the end of their retention period. Documents in storage were relocated from a modular building in advance of a remodel.
- All public records requesters received a response to requests within the Oregon Public Records Law timeframe.
- Participated in a Council-appointed Charter Review committee which recommended referring an updated City Charter on the May 2024 ballot.
- Met meeting public notice requirements and filing deadlines to place referrals for a Public Safety Levy Renewal and a Charter Amendment on the May ballot.
- Prepared materials by June 1 for candidates filing by August 27 for council positions on the November 2024 ballot.

Key Investments and Goals for Fiscal Year 2025

- Continue to partner with the City Manager and Information Technology team to oversee hybrid council meetings, ensuring various modes of participation are available for both digital and in-person participants per Oregon House Bill 2560.
- Continue to make council meeting materials more accessible to people needing sight accommodations and maintain closed captioning on meeting videos for those with hearing difficulties.
- Improve language access to City Council meetings by translating several meetings, depending on community interest.
- Conduct elections for Councilors in November 2024 (number of positions depends on results of May 2024 Charter amendment) including meeting public notice requirements and filing deadlines.
